Benefits

Marching Band offers students rewarding opportunities for personal growth and life changing experiences. When students leave high school they don't just leave with fond memories and musical skill, rather, they leave with a skillset that sets them apart on the career path that they choose. Below is a portion of an article by Alix Kirckpatrick an HR professional with interviewstream outlining just 5 of the great benefits of a high school marching experience!

"At high schools around the country, in the first weeks of August, there is a tradition that only those who are musically inclined and willing to work hard participate in. This is Marching Band Camp season, and many high school and college marching bands begin their pre-season preparatory work in the heat of the summer, outside on the scalding turf, while other kids sit in the cool air conditioning and play video games.

As an HR professional, what can you take away from this? What might you want to know about marching band members that makes their resumes stand out and makes them more attractive candidates? According to Virtual Music Office, there are at least 10 identifiable benefits to working with kids who have high-stepped through high school and beyond. These include the following concepts:

1 | RESPECT

Band students learn to appreciate and respect hierarchy in an organization. Each instrument is part of a section with a section leader, who then reports to an Assistant Drum Major, who reports to the Drum Major, who reports to the Band Director (and so on). By learning to operate through and within a direct and dotted-line chain of command, these players start out ahead of the game.

2 | PRODUCTIVITY

Band students understand that in order to make things work at their best, they have to be productive during work time. This isn't to say that the kids don't have fun at band camp, but it certainly shows what can be accomplished in as little as a week with previously untrained marchers if everyone digs in and works hard.

3 | COLLABORATION

Working together is always better. Band students know they have to move in unison, keep time with each other and, to a lesser extent, keep each other on track as well as keeping a key level of attention on their own obligations. This sense of teamwork keeps harmony and unity among a diverse group of individuals that lends itself well to any organization's operations.

4 | PLANNING AND TIME MANAGEMENT

Marchers know they need to keep their instruments in top form to do their best. Whether this means making sure they are well-rested so they can give their all, or keeping all the necessary parts of their equipment properly prepared, they learn the benefits of good planning and strong time management skills.

5 | BEING PART OF THE BIGGER PICTURE

Band students are able to sometimes blend into the forest and sometimes just be trees. In the Band Director's mind, there may be a formation that no one student can ever see but that can really only be perceived from the big picture viewpoint. Band students may not have the perspective to understand why they need to be in a particular position to form an image on the field, but they understand their presence in the right place is essential.


NEW UNIFORMS 2021!

Ways to Pay:

- Online- You can access our online store <u>HERE</u> or by going to our website <u>www.mariettabands.com</u> and clicking on payments.
- 2. Check- All checks should be made out to the Marietta Band Association or MBA. *Please make sure that your student's name is indicated on the check in the memo line.*
 - O Bring a check to the band room at the end of each practice, check it off with one of the board members, and place it in the drop box by the office in the band room, the tan/gray box located by the corner office. Do not hand your funds to the directors, they will not handle them. Your cashed check will serve as your receipt. In the case you choose to pay in cash, please contact a treasurer for your receipt. You will be notified of any outstanding balance.

RULES & ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Any student not current on their payments will not be allowed to practice or march.
- 2. No refund of any dues will be given to any family or student for any reason including family moving, school conflicts, or a change of mind. The only exception would be for serious health issues (must be validated by a physician's note).
- 3. If a student decides to stop marching after committing to the marching band, ALL dues are still due and payable by the beginning of band camp. Not paying the complete dues may result in discipline issues from MHS including the possibility of not walking with your graduating class.
- 4. Any student whose family receives a Section 8 voucher and/or subsidized lunches for the current year are eligible for special fees for marching band. Students who receive special reduced fees are mandated to participate in all fundraising events to help offset the reduced fee. Proof of voucher must be submitted and actual fees are determined by the board on a case by case basis.
- 5. Students must be registered in a band class in order to participate. If a student is not able to be in a band class due to a conflict with IB, they must provide a letter to the directors from the IB counselor speaking to the conflict.
- 6. Students will also be responsible for purchasing the following:
 - a. Marching Shoes (Required Approximately \$45)
 - b. Section jackets/shirts (Optional)

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

- 1. A full rehearsal and performance calendar is attached.
- 2. All rehearsals and performances are MANDATORY.
- 3. Students who must miss a rehearsal must report their absence via google form on the website.
- 4. Absences must be reported at least 2 DAYS in advance.
- 5. Last-minute absences such as illness or family emergencies should be reported to Mr. Marimon within a reasonable time frame.
- 6. If you are absent from school, please bring Mr. Marimon the attendance note the day you return.
- 7. Absences from performances will not be permitted except in the most extenuating circumstances.
- 8. Rehearsals begin on time and will end on time. *The start/end time of rehearsals DOES NOT include travel time or setup and store equipment.*
- 9. Due to our new rehearsal start time, being tardy to rehearsal is not permitted for tutoring or club meetings. You must communicate with your club-sponsor your obligations to the ensemble.

ATTENDANCE CONSEQUENCES:

- 1. Absences will be EXCUSED or UNEXCUSED at the discretion of the directors. A general rule to follow is that if MCS will excuse it, so will we.
- 3. ANY UNEXCUSED ABSENCE during the week of the performance WILL result in the student in question being sidelined for the upcoming performance.
- 4. After August 1st THREE unexcused absences in the course of the season will result in removal from the ensemble.
- 5. If you are sidelined, you must still attend IN UNIFORM.
- 6. Any instance of ISS or OSS will be considered UNEXCUSED. You may not attend rehearsal if you are suspended.
- 7. Unexcused tardies will be made up prior to or after rehearsal BEFORE the following performance.
- 8. Failing to adhere to the attendance policy will negatively impact receiving the .25 P.E. credit for marching this fall.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The MBA is prepared to offer financial assistance for those families/students who have the greatest need for support. We are sensitive to each family's individually unique situation and will attempt to do all we can to help. To apply for the MBA financial assistance, the following is due on or before May 22nd for consideration for the 2021 season:

- 1. The online form <u>CLICK HERE</u>, filled out fully (incomplete applications will not be considered)
- 2. An essay written by the STUDENT as to why they would like to participate in the marching band, what benefits it would bring them personally, AND what they will bring to the group.
- 3. Families **MUST** agree to participate in **fundraising activities**, **volunteer at minimum of FIVE EVENTS through the season**, **including ONE major event** to receive MBA financial assistance. If this is not satisfied, financial assistance will not be an option for future years.

SCRIP: For parents wanting an easy way to reduce marching band fees, SCRIP is the answer. By using SCRIP, you get band fundraising credit for purchasing things you normally buy everyday. That means you'll pay less out-of-pocket for your child's band fees because you've built up credit in the SCRIP program.

You can start using SCRIP immediately, earning the Blue Devil Marching Band credits even before your child starts school at Marietta High School!

SCRIP may be the easiest, most convenient method to support the Marietta High School Band and reduce your child's participation fees. Band families earn 1% up to 12% on SCRIP purchases, and sometimes more during special promotions! A small portion goes directly to the band, and the rest is credited to your family's account.*

^{*}In order to receive any credit through SCRIP, you must sign a waiver form.

The Positive Parent: One of the most important aspects of this band program is positive parent involvement and support. Below are a few guidelines to make sure you are being a positive band parent:

- While chaperoning, volunteering or in the presence of band members and other band parents, always keep comments and conversation positive!
- Make sure you remember and compliment all the work your student, and other students have done to produce a show!
- Please avoid gossip and other conversation that may be detrimental to the band or other Marietta organizations. Try to avoid knee-jerk reactions. Be a PRO!
- Please avoid having conversations about other students with other adults, unless it is to complement them!

The Encouraging Parents: Music learning, music performance, and music appreciation are the outcomes of study, practice, and guided listening. With limited rehearsal time, it is imperative that students invest extra time in nurturing their talents and improving their skills Some helpful tips are below:

- Please encourage a consistent practice schedule for your child at home. Remember that practice time must be framed as a benefit and not a disciplinary penalty.
- Please consider private lessons for your child. Nothing can substitute one-on-one instruction with a professional. The time spent in private lessons has huge rewards and pay-offs in the end.
- Please encourage your child to participate in all band events.

The Booster Parent: There are many ways to aid and participate in our parent support organization. Please join with other parents who realize the far-reaching potential of each child in the band and take advantage of joy created by sharing a common goal. The Marietta Band Association helps to ensure a stable and supportive band program. Your involvement makes a difference!
